## 120-Credit Program for Business Students Entering the Preparatory Year

Students entering with 12 years of school education are required to follow the 120-credit program. This program requires students to complete a minimum total of 120 credits, comprising courses required by their degree program and some additional credits. All these courses count towards the calculation of the Graduation Grade Average (GGA) used for determining the class of honors on graduation. For the purpose of calculating the GGA, courses in the students' first year of study will be given a weighting of 0.5 , while those taken beyond the first year be given a weighting of 1.0.

Students following the 120-credit program are subject to the same set of academic regulations that are applicable to regular undergraduate students. The normal duration of study for the 120-credit program is four years. For the academically more aggressive and capable students, they may complete the 120-credit program in less than four years. Except the 6 credits of Common Core courses, students are expected to complete the additional credits in their first year of study.
